A Defining Moment for the Church, Family and Community

We stand at a crucial and decisive moment in the chronicle of world history. Looking around at the world today, the Church is faced with so many challenges that need to be addressed with utmost urgency. Nations are clamored with wars and uprisings, social order is at a decline, poverty and injustice are a major crisis with so many homeless, marginalized and orphaned left to fend for themselves, unloved and uncared for. Challenges before Us

- Ideological Challenge of Islam & Hinduism An examination of issues surrounding religious fundamentalism, the turnaround within North-East India and other regional issues (Islam & Hinduism)
- 2. Family Challenge A call to integrity, purity and witness in Christian marriages and families
- Orphan Challenge A focus on caring for orphans with a view to a region without orphans
- Poverty Challenge A focus on availability of basic needs among the poorest communities in North-East India
- Justice Challenge A call toward a civil society including addressing casteism

- 6. Missional Challenge A commitment to reach the last and the least
- Workplace challenge/Celebration Challenge An opportunity to identify, connect and encourage Christian workers in every Northeast Indian state
- 8. Ethnicity & Identity Crisis Challenge To identify ourselves in Christ above all regional, communal and denominational disparities
- Christian Entrepreneurship Challenge A movement towards developing and encouraging Christian entrepreneurs
- Nominalism Challenge A challenge to fight nominalism and bring back nominal and Sunday Christians to church and mission
- Integrated Farming Challenge A focus on innovative and stateof-the-art means of productive farming for rural as well as urban areas
- 12. Digital Mission Challenge An opportunity to grab the advantage of technology and virtual methods to reach out to more people
