





## The Million Village Challenge: Now More Than Ever!

The poorest of the poor, living in approximately a million villages, are crying out for help. Their suffering has been aggravated by COVID-19, pushing many to the brink of starvation and death.

On October 7, 2020, the World Bank reported that COVID-19 was expected to add as many as 150 million extreme poor by 2021. They predicted that the pandemic might push 1.4% of the world's population into extreme poverty. Just a few months later on December 3, 2020, the United Nations reported that the pandemic had already pushed more than 32 million people into extreme poverty.

The world's village poor suffer from multiple disadvantages at the same time -poor health or malnutrition, a lack of clean water or electricity, food insecurity, and lack of education. These are the world's most vulnerable and will be the hit hardest.

Even before the pandemic, God raised up tens of thousands of Christian workers around the world to engage with these communities to make disciples while lifting their communities out of cycles of poverty and disease. You are likely receiving this letter because you are one of them.

If you are, you have probably felt the impact yourself. You may be grieving the pain of suffering friends or even your own hardship. You are not alone. Keeping transformational development ministries going has been difficult in the age of lockdowns. In a majority of places around the world, development work has been brought to an abrupt halt. For the first time in 20 years, extreme poverty is on the rise again globally.



What can we as development workers do while we are "locked down"? In dark times, God's light shines brightest. It is time for the church to rise. As development workers, we are the eyes and ears of the church. This is our time.

Together let's sound the alarm and call the church to action. We will be putting up a Million Village Challenge website soon in multiple languages to help give you voice. It may take a little time, so stay tuned.
