The Million Village Challenge



Approximately 16% of the world's population are multidimensionally poor, the majority of them in rural poor villages in South Asia and Africa. More than half of these (about 56%) are still without the light of Christ. If we are going to finish the task among the unreached, we need word and deed ministries that move beyond projects in a single village to transformational movements that sweep the countryside. If you are looking for such a strategy, you might want to get a copy of the book "Beyond Poverty: Multiplying Sustainable Community Development".
